Description

The first meeting of sister cities Jõhvi and Olecko took place from 5 to 8 June 2025 in Jõhvi, Estonia, bringing together 100 participants, including 47 women and 53 men. The full program was successfully implemented, offering a rich combination of cultural exchange, youth involvement, civic dialogue, and community celebration.

The visit began with a guided introduction to Jõhvi's municipal and educational institutions, including the town government, concert hall, basic school, and the Kood/Jõhvi programming school, giving the Polish delegation a comprehensive view of local life and development. Parallel workshops and recreational opportunities were provided for participants at the accommodation site.

One of the central moments was the Hackathon at Tammiku community center, where young participants from both towns developed ideas to strengthen youth participation and cross-border cooperation. This was followed by a cultural evening and LoomeÖÖ, a vibrant open-air event at Jõhvi Art School, featuring music, performances, a local fair, and a Polish cultural tent that presented Olecko's handicrafts and traditions.

On 7 June, a friendly football tournament created a space for informal interaction, followed by the Jőhvi Community Day at the central park and music square. The Polish delegation contributed with approximately 1.5 hours of cultural performances, including traditional songs and dances, which were warmly received by the local audience. The day ended with a communal dinner and social evening.

The main achievements of the event include the renewed and strengthened partnership between Jőhvi and Olecko, meaningful youth and cultural engagement, increased visibility of European cooperation at the local level, and the establishment of solid foundations for future collaboration and exchange between the two municipalities.
